Note from Chinese Teacher:

Note from English Teacher:

This week the children continued to work on their persuasive writing skills. They are learning how to state an opinion, and supplying a specific reason ('because') by listing attributes and facts.

This week we brainstormed characteristics of animals as a class and then the children picked their favourite animal and wrote three reasons to back their choices.

UOI Learning:

This week we began our English Led Unit of Inquiry (UOI). The children have been unpacking the Central Idea: People share the planet with different types of animals and may impact their habitats. The children focused on identifying the meaning of the words 'people', 'planet', 'animals', 'impact', and 'habitat', and have been been using actions to help them to remember. The children also identified what it means to share the planet.

The children went to the library to help select UOI books for the classroom. They learnt how to select books are related to our Central Idea and will help further their learning in the classroom.

Next week the children will focus on the first Line of Inquiry: classifying animals. They will explore what it means to sort and classify, and investigate different ways to do so. The children will observe/present how animals can be classified into the groups mammals, fish, amphibians, reptiles and birds.

The children will also explore how animals can be sorted by vertebrates and invertebrates.

Math:

In Chinese class, students will continue to work on the math concept of **skip counting** by 3's & 4's **using number chart** (1-50/1-100) or **number line**.

We will use different manipulatives for students **sorting or grouping objects** by 3 and 4.
