Important Messages:

The K3 classes are still taking names of parents who would like to volunteer to be a class parent. We would like to have two class parents per class. Math:

We have started learning about standard and nonstandard measurement. The children have been measuring different classroom items.

Next week in support of our Family UOI, the children will be learning about glyphs. They will explore what a glyph is, as well as how to make one.

Note from Chinese Teacher:

In Chinese we have been assessing the students' Chinese competence in character recognition and oral language skills. The readers and writing radicals were introduced and we have also started to learn new characters, Pinyin sounds. Characters(K3 red; K2 black) / Radicals / Pinyin Cycle 2:[这/是/我的/爱/爸/妈/姐/妹] > // [a, o, e] Cycle 3:[自己/会/全家/人/爷/奶/哥/弟]人/力 [i(y), u(w), ü]

Note from English Teacher:

We have begun our year long UOI: There are many similarities in the way people celebrate around the world. During the year the children will explore different celebrations, and inquire into the ways in which people discover and express ideas, feelings, nature, culture, beliefs and values. We are also supporting the current Chinese UOI on Families by introducing topic vocabulary, stories, writing activities and math activities. We have been reviewing phonics sounds and using them to write words during our mini writers workshops. We have also been reviewing starter spelling words.

UOI Learning:

Last week we started discussing our 1st UOI about Celebrations: there are many similarities in the way people celebrate around the world. The first celebration we discussed was Mother's day. This UOI will run all year long as we will be discussing some international celebrations as they happen. This unit will be lead in the English language and will be supported in Chinese. We also started our 2nd UOI about Family History: Every family has its own unique history. During this unit we will be asking families to make a family tree at home. Please find an A3 size family tree template in your child's folder and return to class as soon as possible so we can have group sharing in class.



Library Expectations and Rules
